Summary of essential elements of citing / Referee's report / Incident footage

9.13 A player must not tackle an opponent early, late or dangerously.

Israel 15 tackled Turkey 8 who was the ball carrier. Israel 15's shoulder made direct contact with the head of Turkey 8. Israel 15 was always upright in the tackle, no attempt to dip. There was no change of angle by the ball carrier Turkey 8.

Essential elements of other evidence (e.g. medical reports)

I have reviewed the available video in real time and slow motion.

I also had the evidence given by the Player and representatives.

Summary of player's evidence

The Player accepted head contact and foul play. The Player accepted that his position was upright but he denied the red card treshold has been met due to the following reasons:

- 1. Head contact was initiated by the ball carrier,
- 2. The tackler was passive
- 3. The force of the impact was low and that caused the degree of danger was not high. The Player is 18 years old and is a school pupil. He has 4 years of experience in playing rugby

Findings of fact

From the video footage it was clear that there was a direct head contact with the opponent.

I find this action reckless and dangerous, contrary to Law 9.13

Following World Rugby's Head Contact Process:

- 1. Head contact was made by Izraeli 15's shoulder directly to the head of Turkish 8. I also considered head on head contact (Izrael 15's jaw to the opponents eyebrow area but the video from available angle is not clear). From available video it is more likely, that the first impact/contact was made by Izrael 15's shoulder.
- 2. Izraeli 15 was always in a upright position, with unobstructed line of sight towards the ball carrier.
- 3. The impact is direct and forceful because the ball carier was in a full speed. That is the reason I find the degree of danger was high.
- 4. No mitigation was available as I considered that there wasn't sufficient change in height or direction. No other player was involved in the tackle.

I didn't accept players statement that he was a passive tackler as it was clear, after reviewing the footage, that Izrael 15's body did not absorb the impact nor falls backwards. World Rugby low application guidelines expect a zero forward movement into the ball carrier. After reviewing available footage, I believe that the forward movement has been made by Izrael 15 therefore I did not mitigate the red card.
